

Safeguarding Curriculum

Across the Fioretti Trust, our safeguarding curriculum is designed to empower children with the knowledge, confidence, and skills they need to keep themselves safe. Through carefully planned PSHE, RSE, online safety education, and wider curriculum opportunities, children learn how to recognise unsafe situations, understand healthy relationships, manage risks, and seek help when needed. We work with trusted external organisations, to enhance this learning and ensure it reflects current risks both online and offline. Children are explicitly taught who they can talk to if they are worried, and receive those hard to hear messages about recognising signs of abuse in their own lives, they are encouraged to use their voices confidently. **Our aim is to ensure every child understands their rights, feels safe in school, and is equipped to make safe, informed choices in their daily lives.**

The Fioretti Trust is committed to creating an inclusive environment where every child is valued, respected, and safe, regardless of background, ability, identity, or need. We recognise that some children may face additional barriers to safety or wellbeing, and we are proactive in identifying and removing these barriers through early help, personalised support, and strong relationships. Our safeguarding practice ensures that vulnerable pupils, including those with SEND, social care involvement, or other additional needs, receive tailored support that promotes their safety, dignity, and full participation in school life. We celebrate the diversity of our community and uphold a culture where every child feels seen, heard, and empowered. **Inclusion is at the heart of our safeguarding approach, ensuring that all children can flourish and feel protected across every school in the Fioretti Trust.**

Leadership of Safeguarding

Safeguarding leadership across the Fioretti Trust is strong, strategic, and deeply embedded at every level. The Head of Trust sets the overall safeguarding culture and ensures that it remains a central priority in all schools. Our Safeguarding Trustee provides robust governance oversight, ensuring accountability and compliance with statutory duties. The Trust's Head of Safeguarding leads on policy, practice, consistency, and quality assurance, supporting schools and driving continual improvement. Each school has a designated Lead DSL who oversees day-to-day safeguarding operations, manages concerns, and ensures that staff are confident and well trained. Governors in every school monitor safeguarding rigorously, challenging and supporting leaders to maintain the highest standards. **Together, this leadership structure ensures a coherent, vigilant, and proactive safeguarding system that keeps every child safe.**

Policies and Training

The Fioretti Trust maintains safeguarding policies that meet all statutory requirements and are reviewed annually to ensure they remain current, robust, and effective. All staff and Governors are required to read and understand the Trust Safeguarding Policy and the latest version of Keeping Children Safe in Education (KCSIE) each year. Safeguarding training is mandatory for all staff, with induction training for new colleagues and regular updates across the year. Additional termly updates, briefings, and scenario based learning ensure that safeguarding remains at the forefront of our professional responsibilities. **Through this consistent cycle of policy review and high quality training, we ensure that every member of our community is equipped to recognise, respond to, and report safeguarding concerns effectively.**
